The U.S. Department of Agriculture announced that a referendum will be conducted for the purpose of determining producer approval of the Western Milk Marketing Order, as amended in the August 8 Tenta tive Fin al Decision. Additionally, USDA is extending the deadline for filing comments to that decision as it pertains to the Western Order to A pril 1, 2004.

The August 8, Tenta tive Final Decision amended pooling provisions of the Western order. Determination of producer approval of the order, by a polling of cooperatives, could not be ascertained so a referendum must be held. The referendum shall be completed on or before December 1, 2003.

USDA LAUNCHES WEB SITE FEATURING STATE MARKETING PROFILES

The U.S. Department of A griculture announced the hunch of a new Internet Web site that provides marketing profiles for all 50 states.

The site includes in-depth statistical in formation on farms, including size, market value, cropland, livestock inventories and commodities. There also are demographic and food consumption statistics for the major metropolitan areas in each State.

Developed by USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service, the site provides location and contact information for farmers markets, descriptions of AMS marketing projects and grants, and information on how to find organic certifying agents and organic contacts in each state department of agriculture. There is also a brief marketing summary of each state.

The site is aimed at market developers, state departments of agriculture, academics and other data collectors, as well as consumers interested in m arketing activities in their state.

USDA SEEKS NOMINATIONS FOR NATIONAL FLUID MILK BOARD

The U.S. Department of Agriculture is asking dairy processors and other interested parties to nominate candidates for the National Fluid Milk Processor Promotion Board.

The Secretary of Agriculture will appoint seven individuals from those nominated to succeed members whose terms expire June 30, 2004. New ly appointed or reappointed members will serve 3-year terms from July 1, 2004, through June 30, 2007.

USDA will accept nominations for board representation in five geographic regions and for two at-large positions. Nominees must be active owners or employees of a fluid milk processor for all regional positions and at least one at-large position. The other at-large position

may be filled by a member of the general public. Fluid milk processors and interested parties may submit nominations for regions in which they are located or market fluid milk and for at-large members.

To nominate an individual, please submit completed nomination and background forms for each nominee by December 5, 2003. SEPTEMBER MILK PRODUCTION DOWN 0.1PERCENT

Milk production in the 20 major States during September totaled 11.6 billion pounds, down 0.1 percent from September 2002. August revised production, at 12.1 billion pounds, was down 0.9 percent from August 2002. The August revision represented a decrease of 17 million pounds from last month's preliminary production estimate.

Production per cow in the 20 major States averaged 1,503 pounds for September, 6 pounds more from September 2002.

The number of milk cows on farms in the 20 major States was 7.74 million head, 38,000 head less than September 2002, and 7,000 head less than A ugust 2003.

The Mideast Marketing Area has four states represented in the 20 major states used above. They are Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, and Pennsylvania. Milk production in these Mideast states during Septem ber totaled 1.9 billion pounds, down 45 million pounds or 2.4 percent from September 2002.

Production per cow in the Mideast states averaged 1,465 pounds for September, 15 pounds above September 2002.

The number of cows on farms in the Mideast states was $1.3\,\mathrm{m\,illion}$ head, 29,000 head less than September 2002.

ORDER 33 MARKET SUMMARY

The Producer Price Differential for the Mideast Marketing Area for October 2003 was \$(0.14) and the Statistical Uniform Price was \$14.25 for the month. The Statistical Uniform Price is \$32 higher than last month, and is \$2.93 higher than October 2002.

The Producer Butterfat Price of \$1.2553 per pound increased 3.35 cents from September 2003 and is up 18.27 cents from a year ago. The Protein Price of \$3.2815 is down 3.65 cents from last month and is up \$1.0976 from October 2002. The Other Solids Price in October was \$0.0311 per pound, an increase from last month's price of \$00170 and a decrease of 4.44 cents from last October. The Somatic Cell Adjustment rate for October was \$0.00080.

October producer receipts of 1.1 billion pounds were 73 percent higher than September 2003 and 26.5 percent lower than October 2002 production of 147 billion pounds. Producer milk allocated to Class I accounted for 54.2 percent of the total producer milk in October 2003, less than the 54.8 percent in September and more than the 40.1 percent in October 2002. A total of 10,443 producers were pooled on the Mideast Order with an average daily delivery 3337 of pounds compared to 10,955 producers pooled in October 2002 with an average daily delivery of 4,328 pounds.

The market average content of producer milk w as as follows: Butterfat 3.73%; Protein 3.11%; Other Solids 5.67% and Nonfat Solids 8.78%.
