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2003 MARKET SUMMARY

Producer milk receipts totaled 158 billion pounds on the Mideast Orderduring 2003, a decrease of 1.99 billion pounds, or 11.2 percent from 2002. Large volum es of milk were de-pooled in July-October due to unfavorable pricing conditions. Monthly producer receipts ranged from a high of 1.5 billion pounds in May to a low of 1.0 billion pounds in September.

The average daily delivery per producer during 2003 was 4,211 pounds, a decrease of 120 pounds from last year. The number of producers pooled on the Mideast Orderin 2003 averaged 10,268 per month, down 949, or 85 percent from a year earlier. Producer milk averaged 3.69 percent butterfat ranging from alow of 3.53 percent in July to a high of 3.81 in D ecember. The protein test averaged 3.03 percent for the year. It ranged from a low of 2.92 percent in July, to a high of 3.11 percent in October and December. Other solids averaged 5.71 percent for the year.

For the year, 41.6 percent of producer milk w as utilized as C lass I; 16.4 percent in Class II; 36.5 percent in Class III; and 5.6 percent in Class IV. The Class I utilization percentage had a high of 54.7 percent in September and a low of 33.9 percent in June. Class I milk totaled 6.5 billion pounds during 2003, down 0.1 percent from 2002. Class II milk totaled 2.6 billion pounds, an increase of 14.7 percent from 2002. Class III pooled pounds were 5.8 billion pounds, a decrease of 29.2 % from 2002. Class IV milk totaled 876 million pounds, an increase of 7.4 percent from 2002.

The Class I price averaged \$13.39 for the year, an increase of \$0.38 from 2002. The Class I price had a low of \$11.64 in April and a high of \$16.37 in November. The Class II price averaged \$10.76, a decrease of \$0.79. It was low est in May at \$10.43 and was highest in December at \$11.30. The Class III price averaged \$11.42, an increase of \$1.00. March was the low est price at \$9.11 and October was the highest at \$14.39. The Class IV price averaged \$10.00 for the year, a decrease of \$0.81 from a year ago. It was the low est in A prilat \$9.73 and was highest in D ecember at \$10.52.

The Statistical Uniform Price averaged \$11.96 for 2003 compared to \$11.57 in 2002. The Producer Butterfat Price averaged \$1.2099 per pound in the year 2003. This was an increase of 1.71 cents from 2002. It was low est at \$1.1373 in February and was highest in December at \$13688. The Protein Price averaged \$2.3770 per pound. This was an increase of 40.35 cents from the previous year. The low est was \$16648 in March and the highest was \$3.3180 in September. Other Solids Price averaged \$0.0129 perpound. This was a decrease of 4.64 cents from 2002. It was low estin June with a rate of \$-0.0200 per pound and highest in November with a rate of \$0.0368 perpound. The Producer Price Differential (PPD) averaged \$0.54 cwt. in the year 2003 producing a low in A ugust of \$-1.20 and a high of \$1.39 in D ecember.

USDA SETS HEARING ON PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE APPALACHIAN AND SOUTHEAST MILK ORDERS

The U. S. Department of Agriculture announced it will hold a public hearing to consider proposals to amend the Appalachian and Southeast Federal milk m arketing orders. The hearing will begin at $1:00~\rm pm$ on Febru ary $23^{\rm rd}$ at the Westin A tlanta Airport Hote l, 4736 Best R oad, Atlanta , Georg ia .

The hearing will consider a proposal to merge the Appalachian and Southeast milk marketing areas and proposals to expand the proposed merged order marketing area. Another proposal would create a "Mississippi Valley" order by breaking the Southeast order into two orders. USDA will also consider additional proposals that seek to amend certain other terms and provisions of the orders.

The hearing notice was published as a proposed rule in the January 23rd Federal Register. ORDER 33 MARKET SUMMARY

The Producer Price Differential for the Mideast Marketing Area for January 2004 was \$0.90 and the Statistical Uniform Price was \$12.51 for the month. The Statistical Uniform Price is \$0.75 low er than last month, and is \$1.46 higher than January 2003.

The Producer Butterfat Price of \$1.4978 per pound increased 12.90 cents from December 2003 and is up 31.22 cents from a year ago. The Protein Price of \$2.0875 is down 21.22 cents from last month and is up 27.11 cents from January 2003. The Other Solids Price in January was \$.0217 per pound, a decrease from last month's price of \$0.0362 and a decrease of 1.22 cents from lastJanuary. The Somatic Cell Adjustment rate for January was \$0.00065.

January producer receipts of 1.51 billion pounds were 3.9 percent higher than December 2003, and 3.4 percent higher than January 2003 production of 1.46 billion pounds. Producer milk allocated to Class I accounted for 38.6 percent of the total producer milk in January 2004, the same as in D ecember and less than the 40.8 percent in January 2003. A total of 10,099 producers were pooled on the Mideast Order compared to 10,547 producers pooled in January 2003.

The market average content of producer milk was as follows: Butterfat 3.79%; Protein 3.10%; Other Solids 5.71% and Nonfat Solids 8.81%.

DECEMBER MILK PRODUCTION DOWN 0.3 PERCENT

Milk production in the 20 major States during December totaled 123 billion pounds, down 0.3 percent from December 2002. November revised production, at 117 billion pounds, was down 0.1 percent from November 2002. The November revision represented an increase of 0.1 percent or 13 million pounds from last month's preliminary production estimate.

Production per cow in the 20 major States averaged 1,589 pounds for December, 14 pounds above December 2002.

The number of milk cows on farms in the 20 major States was 7.71 million head, 93,000 head less than December 2002, but unchanged from November 2003.

The Mideast Marketing Area has four states represented in the 20 major states used above. They are Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, and Pennsylvania. Milk production in these Mideast states during December totaled 19 billion pounds, down 41 million pounds or 2.1 percent from D ecember 2002.

Production per cow in the Mideast states averaged 1,550 pounds for December, 22 pounds above December 2002.

The number of cows on farms in the Mideast states was 1.3 million head, 37,000 head less than December 2002.

TIME EXTENDED FOR SUBMISSION OF PROPOSALS TO AMEND FLUID MILK DEFINITION

The Department of Agriculture (USDA) is extending the time period for interested parties to submit additional proposals for consideration with a public hearing request currently under review that would amend the fluidmilk product definition in all Federal milk m arketing orders. The public hearing request was submitted by Dairy Farmers of America (DFA). The deadline for submitting proposals is hereby extended from January 30, 2004, to Septem ber 30, 2004.

If USDA concludes that a hearing should be held, all known interested persons will be mailed a copy of the hearing notice. Anyone who desires to present evidence on proposals set forth in the hearing notice will have an opportunity to do so at the hearing.
