

The Mideast Marketing Area had 4.5 billion pounds of producer milk in the third quarter of 2005. This was a decrease of 26 million pounds or 0.6 % from the third quarter of 2004. The top six states accounted for 4.4 billion pounds of the totalin 2005. This represented a decrease of 2.3 million pounds from the same period in 2004. Milk voluntarily depooled in 2004 was included in the comparison.

Wisconsin had a significant decrease of milk associated with the Mideast Ord erfrom the third quarter of 2004 to the third quarter of 2005. Their producer milk declined 191.2m illion pounds or 20.7 percent for the time period. Producer milk from the states of New York, Pennsylvania, Indiana, Michigan, and Ohio w asup when compared to 2004. It ranged from an increase of $18.1 \,\mathrm{million}$ pounds in Indiana, to an increase of $77.6 \,\mathrm{million}$ pounds in Michigan.



USDA SEEKS NOMINATIONS FOR NATIONAL FLUID MILK BOARD

The U.S. Department of Agriculture is asking dairy processors and other interested parties to no minate candidates for the National Fluid Milk Processor Promotion Board.

The Secretary of Agriculture will appoint seven individuals from those nominated to succeed members whose terms expire June 30, 2006. Newly appointed or reappointed members will serve 3-year terms from July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2009.

USDA will accept nominations for board representation in five geographic regions and two at-large positions. Nominees for the five regional and one at-large processor positions must be active owners or employees of a fluidmilk processor. One at-large position must be from the general public. The geographic regions are: Region 3 (Dela ware, District of Columbia, Maryland, Pennsylvania, and Virginia); Region 6 (Ohio and West Virginia); Region 9 (Alabama, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, and Tennessee); Region 12 (Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico, Nevada, and Utah); and Region 15 (Southern California). No fluidmilk processor shall be represented on the board by more than three members.

Fluidm ilk processors and interested parties may submit nomin ations forregions in which they are located or market fluidm ilk and for at-large members.

ORDER 33 MARKET SUMMARY

The Producer Price Differential for the Mideast Marketing Area for October 2005 was \$0.56 and the Statistical Uniform Price was \$1491 for the month. The Statistical Uniform Price is \$0.03 lower than last month, and is \$0.02 higher than October 2004.

The Producer Butterfat Price of \$1.8256 per pound decreased 6.16 cents from September 2005 and is down 7.64 cents from a year ago. The Protein Price of \$2.3780 is up 7.71 cents from last month and is down 0.34 cents from October 2004. The Other Solids Price in September was \$0.1491 per pound, an increase from last month's price of \$0.1411 and an increase of 8.14 cents from last October. The Somatic Cell Adjustment rate for October was \$0.00075.

October producer receipts of 1.45 billion pounds were 1.5 percent higher than September 2005, and 6.0 percent lower than October 2004 production of 1.55 billion pounds. Producer milk allocated to Class I accounted for 38.9 percent of the total producer milk in October 2005, less than the 40.3 percent in September 2005 and more than the 35.8 percent in October 2004. A total of 8,938 producers were pooled on the Mideast Order compared to 10,183 producers pooled in October 2004.

The market average content of producer milk w as as follows: Butterfat 3.72%; Protein 3.09%; Other Solids 5.68% and Nonfat Solids 8.77%.

SEPTEMBER MILK PRODUCTION UP 4.9 PERCENT

Milk production in the 23 major States during September totaled 13.0 billion pounds, up 4.9 percent from September 2004. August revised production, at 13.6 billion pounds, was up 4.8 percent from August 2004. The August revision represented an increase of 22 million pounds from last month's preliminary production estimate.

Production per cow in the 23 major States averaged 1,597 pounds for September, 64 pounds above September 2004. The number of milk cows on farms in the 23 major States was 8.16 million head, 54,000 head more than September 2004, and 1,000 head more than August 2005.

The Mideast Marketing Area has four states represented in the 23 major states used above. They are Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, and Pennsylvania. Milk production in these Mideast states during September totaled 20 billion pounds, up 120 million pounds or 6.3 percent from September 2004.

Production percowin the Mideast states averaged 1,565 pounds for September, 66 pounds above Septem ber 2004. The number of cows on farms in the Mideast states was 1.3m illion head, 18,000 head more than Septem ber 2004.
